## A Suggested Chronology of Holy Week (JAG Version)

The following chronology seems to me to be way of things – but they are offered only as a suggestion (JAG)

Passover – 6 (Nissan 9) (Saturday) – Shabbat / Jesus arrives in Bethany

John 12: 1

Passover -5 (Nissan 10)

John 12: 2-3 and 12-19

(Saturday evening) Jesus anointed by Mary at supper

(Sunday) Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem

Matthew 21: 1-11 & Daniel 9: 25

Passover – 4\* (Nissan 11) (Monday) Fig Tree Cursed, Temple Cleansed

Passover – 3\* (Nissan 12) (Tuesday) Teaching in the Temple & Conflict

with the Pharisees & Sadducees

Matthew 21: 18 - 45; 22: 1-14; 22: 15- 23: 36

Passover – 2\* (Nissan 13) (Wednesday) Olivet Discourse, Jesus anointed at

Bethany *Matthew 24 - 25, Matthew 26: 6-13* 

Passover – 1\* (Nissan 14) – Preparation Day for Unleavened Bread

\* Four days of inspection of the lamb (Exodus 12: 3-6)

(Wednesday evening) The Last Supper

John 13: 1-17 & Matthew 26: 17-30

(Thursday) Arrest and Trial of Jesus

As Passover lambs were being slaughtered in the temple, Jesus was being crucified - beginning at 9am, dying at 3pm (darkness

from noon to 3pm) *John 19: 1-36 & Matthew 27: 11-55* 

Passover (Pesach) (Nissan 15) (Friday) First Day of Feast of Unleavened Bread

Passover Meal is eaten Thursday Evening (at start of Nissan 15)

Passover + 1 (Nissan 16) (Saturday) Shabbat

Passover + 2 (Nissan 17) (Sunday) Resurrection Day – Mary goes to the tomb very early (while it was still dark) on the morning of 'the first day

of the week' – day after Shabbat

John 20: 1-10

Jewish days begin and end at sunset (i.e. Passover Day starts at around 6.30 pm on Thursday Evening)

Jewish tradition often counts part of a day as a day in its way of speaking – hence Jesus was in the tomb for '3 days' - certainly He was in the tomb 3 days and 3 nights (*Matthew 12: 40*) on this chronology
